

2011 State Ride & Volunteer Days

September 10th & 11th

Whitetail-Pipestone Recreation Area

- **ATV and Motorcycle Trail Riding Both days**
- **Guided rides Saturday and Sunday**
- **Riders will be asked to volunteer for a 3 hour shift working on various projects, geared to your ability.**

Directions: Coming from Whitehall - take Exit 241 (Pipestone Exit) off I-90. Turn right at the stop sign at the end of the exit ramp. Turn left at the gravel road (Delmoe Lake Road) when the pavement ends. Go approx. one mile and cross the railroad tracks. Follow the MTVRA signs from there. The camp is at the Four Corners Trailhead. It is a dry camp but there are two toilets on-site.

There will be 4 three hour work projects, two each day. Ride participants will be asked to participate in at least one project. The volunteer days are part of a pilot program to improve the quality of the riding and overall management of the area. The weekend is part of a partnership between MIC, SVIA, ROHVA, BLM, NOHVCC, and MTVRA to improve the Whitetail Pipestone OHV area. The Mining City Trail Riders are the MTVRA sponsoring club for this weekend, providing ride leaders.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Any minor participating must have the **AMA** minor release form signed by parents or legal guardian. (Contact Mona or Heidi & we can mail you one ahead of time. 406-454-9190)
- All OHVs must have valid OHV decal & USFS approved spark arrestors
- Street legal OHVs with license plates & licensed operators may use forest roads. Unlicensed vehicles and/or riders can ride trails with a valid OHV decal.
- All OHVs MUST meet 96dba stationary sound limit, this is state law.
- **Helmets are required for all riders.**

RULES:

Remember, we're guests of the Butte club and our actions could affect their opportunities in the future. We will be on our best behavior here and wherever we ride!

- Ride only on legal trails. Off-trail use is illegal and will not be tolerated.
- No riding will be allowed in or around the camp or the immediate area. Pit Squids will be shot, hanged, and buried!
- Disorderly behavior will not be tolerated. Loud music or parties aren't allowed.

One of the goals of the weekend will be to help develop a network of volunteers from across the state to help take care of the area. When you arrive you will notice that a great deal of trail maintenance and signing of the trails has occurred as a result of work by the NOHVCC, BLM and the Mining City Trail Riders.
